Right around the Corner:

Trappers,

It is getting to be that time of the year again where the season is right around the corner. It is time to start dragging gear out from last year and getting it ready. Far too often we wait till the last minute to get things ordered, prepped, and ready. Get everything cleaned up, fix all those bent dogs, get pans adjusted, levers tweaked and pan tension set. Cable stakes made, drags checked over and sharpened, and just a general overview of all your gear in general. I lose trapping equipment every year on the line. I try to have two of everything, hammers, sifters and anything else I use regularly. The old adage "Two is one, and one is none" still holds true. Getting pan covers cut, collecting T-bones and cutting PVC pipes for sets. Get bait and lure ordered soon to avoid the big rush that's coming. Getting prepared and ready before season will save you time on the line to set more gear.

Now is the time to start looking your different traplines over. Look at getting a few new locations to trap. I gain access for bobcat trapping every year by trapping and hunting the coyotes as well. Start with scent circles to check out both old and new locations. If you can afford it a few game cameras will help scouting far out spots to and see what is traveling thru the area. Have a pre-determined route before the season. It's the little things that add up costing you time and money.

Lastly is the truck. It needs a good going over to make sure it's ready for season. Beside just good general maintenance, belts, hoses, fluids, have the front end checked over, look at your tires, and check the spare. I prefer to carry two spares now after getting stranded one night with just one. Run good tires! Check ride height, I have broken several pairs of leaf springs and check ride height to see how they are doing. Always carry extra water, oil, and basic survival gear.

Hope this helps and hope everyone has a good season, see you at the convention!

Hey Trapper's




Hello trappers,
